BUDGET AGREEMENT SITS WELL WITH VOTERS

Phoenix, Arizona, May 26, 2005. The battle over the budget appears to have had a modest favorable impact on the Governor's job rating. Today, 58 percent in Maricopa County give her "excellent" or "good" job ratings and another 21 percent say she is doing a "fair" job. "Poor" job ratings total only 15 percent for the Governor. This compares to 54 percent favorable in April and 18 percent unfavorable.

When compared to the beginning of the year, the legislature's stature seems to have eroded slightly in this county as negative ratings rise to 18 percent from 14 and positive ratings declined to 28 from 35 percent.

The findings outlined in this report are based on a survey of 600 heads of household throughout Maricopa County conducted between May 19 and May 23, 2005, by the Behavior Research Center of Arizona as part of the Center's independent and non-partisan Rocky Mountain Poll series. Eight of ten voters in Maricopa County rate the budget passed by the legislature and signed by the Governor favorably, including roughly a third who characterize it as an "excellent" or "good" budget. Fewer than a fifth think it is a "poor" budget, including only 16 percent of Republicans.

EDITOR'S NOTE: This Rocky Mountain Poll Arizona (2005-II-07) is based on 600 telephone interviews conducted from May 19 through May 23, 2005, with adult heads of household throughout Maricopa County. In a sample of this size, one may say with 95 percent certainty that the results have a statistical precision of plus or minus 4.08 percent of what they would have been had the entire adult population been surveyed. The Rocky Mountain Poll is conducted by the Behavior Research Center of Arizona and is an independent and non-partisan research program.
